C-5M tests, evaluations complete

After nearly four months of missions and demonstrations, Team Dover Airmen completed operational testing and evaluation of the C-5M Super Galaxy. With OT&E complete, the Air Force Operational Test and Evaluation Center will present their findings to the Department of Defense and Congress, based on the tests conducted at Dover AFB.

Throughout OT&E, 436th and 512th Airlift Wing aircrews flew various missions to demonstrate the capabilities and reliability of the C-5M. These missions included local training missions and wartime surge operations designed along wartime operational parameters.

During OT&E, the three C-5Ms assigned to Dover AFB delivered 4.5 million pounds of cargo, with more than 3.8 million pounds moved during the 30-day surge operations, said Maj.
