Air Force Safety remodels ORM program

The Air Force is introducing four major changes to the Air Force Operational Risk Management program soon.

The Air Force ORM is a decision-making process used to systematically evaluate possible courses of action, identify risks and benefits, and determine the best course of action for any given situation.

"The changes being put in place will make it easier for the individual Airman to implement the process of risk management," said Lt. Col. Don Whitley, chief of the 512th Airlift Wing Safety Office.

"The idea is that our reservists can use this process not just while in the uniform but also in their civilian jobs," he said. "We want our people to remain safe while they're not here."

The Air Force Instruction governing risk management, AFI 90-901, is currently being rewritten in order to reflect these changes.

ADX migration begins next week

The 512th Airlift Wing and Team Dover will be part of the Active Directory and Exchange migration initiative, transferring cyber operations to a central network in an effort to increase customer service while reducing operation costs.

The migration, scheduled to begin April 29 and be phased in during the next six weeks, will change e-mail as well as log-in access for all AF users, including reservists.

The E-mail For Life concept was introduced in 2005 and implemented gradually, beginning in 2007. Each user will have an e-mail account ending in @us.af.mil.

E-mail with one domain will be easier, said Tech. Sgt. Latoya Greene, 512th AW Network Center. It'll be first name.last name, so it will be easier to find someone on the global address list, she said.

Another change affecting e-mail is mailbox size limit. Under ADX, Category I users will receive a warning when their mailbox size reaches 950 MB. At 975 MB, users will not be able to send; and, once a mailbox reaches 1 GB, sending and receiving will be prohibited. Conversely, Category II users will see an increase in mailbox size limits.

The other major change in ADX is reservists will be able to log on to the Internet at any AF location, explained Tech. Sgt. Robert Roach, 512th AW Network Center. This will allow individuals the opportunity to access e-mail as well as the AF Portal, Virtual Military Personnel Flight and other programs from anywhere.
