Early retired pay law revised

The National Defense Authorization Act permitting Reserve members below age 60 to draw retired pay, three months for every cumulative 90 days of active duty in a fiscal year, has been revised. Now, the qualifying time counts without regard to crossing a fiscal year. Like the previous version, the revised law cannot reduce the age for collecting retired pay below 50 years old. POTUS signs pay freeze

President Barack Obama signed legislation to prohibit pay changes for most Federal civilian employees Dec. 22, 2010. Pay adjustments not covered by the freeze include promotion increases, within-grade step increases and other similar individual-based pay increases. Locality pay will remain at the 2010 levels. The statute, which is expected to effect around 2 million Federal civilian employees, covers pay adjustments that would have taken effect from Jan. 1, 2011, to Dec. 31, 2012.

Officials from the Air Force Reserve and Air National Guard announced the 2011 Air Force Reserve and ANG Teen Leadership Summit locations Jan. 5. They are Dahlonega, Ga.; Estes, Colo.; and Washington.
