vPC-GR migrates to new AFPERS website

The Air Force Reserve has begun centralizing personnel services via a total force single access platform called the Air Force Personnel Services website. AFPERS is a new capability that will improve and better incorporate knowledge, services and search capability functions, making it simpler for Airmen to find answers to their personnel questions. AFPERS delivers a global, 24-hours-a-day, 7-days-a-week personnel service capability for the active-duty, Air National Guard, AF Reserve, civilian and retiree population, providing standardized platforms that are easy to use.

An important component of the AFPERS centralization is the migration of the vPC-GR dashboard. Effective 28 June, reservists will have to access vPC-GR services through AFPERS. Current vPC-GR accounts will migrate to the AFPERS web site; though first-time users will be prompted to validate accounts and answer five security questions upon initial log in.
