### **DFAC reopens after renovations**

After being closed for more than two weeks due to renovations, the Patterson Dining Facility here reopened its doors Friday.

The renovations, which began Oct. 17, include a re-designed full-serving line, all new serving equipment, freshly painted walls, a centrally located salad bar; relocation of the sandwich island, silverware and trays; different wall décor and a new self-serve ice cream machine.

The most notable of the changes is the removal of walls in the general serving area, which as a result, created more space for patrons and workers to operate.

"Knocking down the walls opens up the facility a lot," said Master Sgt. Christian Blankenship, 512th Memorial Affairs Squadron NCO in charge of food operations. "Things seemed very confined before the renovations; hopefully, the open area will help with the congestion and improve customer flow."

Tech. Sgt. Enid J-Ellis, 512th MAS dining facilities supervisor, likes the changes and believes the renovations have already shown signs of promise.

"The new look is refreshing," said J-Ellis. "Things are a lot less cluttered, and you can certainly see a difference in the flow of traffic."

Although the majority of the feedback from the DFAC staff has been positive, customers are expected to need time to adapt to the modifications.

#### **Emergency alert test Wednesday**

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency and the Federal Communications Commission will conduct the first nationwide test of the Emergency Alert System. The nationwide test will occur at 2 p.m., Wednesday and may last up to three and a half minutes. The EAS is a national alert and warning system established to enable the President of the United States to address the American public during emergencies.

The National Weather Service, governors and state and local emergency authorities also use parts of the system to issue more localized emergency alerts. The nationwide test will involve broadcast

radio and television stations, cable television, satellite radio and television services and wireline video service providers across all states and the territories of Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands and American Samoa.

## DAFB loses 39 civilian postions

Following the Air Force's Nov. 2 announcement about the elimination of 9,000 civilian positions, hundreds of civilians and supervisors gathered in the base theater Nov. 3 to attend one of five Town Hall meetings.

Base officials anounced 39 civilian positions within the 436th Airlift Wing would be eliminated. Twenty-seven would be cut in April 2012, and an additional 12 are slated

for Oct. 1, 2012. As of now, no civilian positions have been eliminated from the 512th AW, Air Force Mortuary Affairs Operations or any other tenant unit on base.
