Civilian rule on leave to vote

Employees requesting time off to vote are excused without charge to leave for the amount of time necessary to permit them to report to work three hours after the polls open or to leave work three hours before the polls close, whichever requires the least amount of time off. Normally, if the polls are open three hours before or after the employee's duty hours, no time off is granted.

Servicemembers have new voting option available

Servicemembers can now take advantage of new options intended to make voting easier. For voters in many states, absentee ballots can be obtained electronically for printing and mailing. Additionally, according to officials from the Federal Voting Assistance Program, "voters from all 55 states and territories can use the FVAP online Federal Write-in Absentee Ballot automated assistant to vote for at least all federal candidates."
