Donations got off to a slow start in the base theater's parking lot, but by the end of the second wing commander's call, there were enough canned goods and supplies to fill a couple of C-5 tires.

Prior to the drive, organizers attained wish-list items from Mom's House and The Shepherd Place. Almost all of the requested items came in, and they were delivered Dec. 5-6. In addition, about \$400 worth of food was donated to the Delaware Food Bank.

"The proceeds from this event help demonstrate our Citizen Airman connection to the communities we live and work in," said Col. Randal L. Bright, 512th AW commander. "It's an honor to be able to share with oth-

ers during this holiday season."

The Shepherd Place provides relief to individuals and families who are in distress or dire economic situations and serves as a short-term emergency shelter for the homeless.

At Mom's Place, pre-school children receive quality care and early education while their single parents are plugged into a network of supportive services that enable them to complete their education, find jobs and get off of welfare, according to their website.

The Food Bank of Delaware's mission is a community free of hunger. They provide low and no-cost food to qualified feeding programs throughout the state.
