# COLONEL NORMAN B. SHAW JR.

Col. Norman B. Shaw Jr. is the vice commander of the 512th Airlift Wing, an Air Force Reserve Command associate wing located at Dover Air Force Base, Delaware. The 1,750-person wing supports Air Mobility Command's global airlift mission, operating C-5M Super Galaxy and C-17A Globemaster III aircraft.

Colonel Shaw was commissioned through the Air Force Officer Training School in 1998 and earned his pilot wings as a Distinguished Graduate of Specialized Undergraduate Pilot Training at Laughlin AFB, Texas. His operational background includes strategic airlift experience flying C-141, C-5 and C-17 aircraft, while serving in numerous operations including Operation Enduring Freedom, Operation Iraqi Freedom and the National Science Foundation's resupply mission to McMurdo Station, Antarctica.

Prior to his current position, Colonel Shaw served as Director of Operations, 618th Air Operations Center, Tanker Airlift Control Center, 18th Air Force, Headquarters AMC, Scott AFB, Illinois, In that role, he orchestrated the largest Air Operations Center in the Department of Defense and served as the focal point for operations of over 1,100 aircraft and 600 missions per day, encompassing aircraft from active, Guard and Reserve components. His past assignments include service at HQ AFRC, along with joint service at United States Transportation Command and the Joint Staff.
