COLONEL GREGORY P. HAYNES

Col. Gregory P. Haynes is the Commander of the 512th Airlift Wing, an Air Force Reserve Command associate wing located at Dover Air Force Base, Delaware. He is the senior officer responsible for the 1,650-person organization, which supports AFRC's and Air Mobility Command's worldwide airlift mission, operating C-5M Super Galaxy and C-17 Globemaster III aircraft.

Colonel Haynes was commissioned through the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps in 1990 at the University of Tennessee. Since completing pilot training in 1995, he has served as a tactical airlift pilot in operations Joint Guard, Joint Resolve, Enduring Freedom, Iraqi Freedom, New Dawn and Horn of Africa as well as contingencies in the Balkans, Sierra Leon and Nigeria. He was a pioneer in the use of night vision equipment for tactical airlift and has flown over 3,500 hours and over 400 combat and combat support missions. Colonel Haynes also has extensive experience on Numbered Air Force, Major Command and Pentagon staffs.

Prior to assuming his current position, Colonel Haynes was the Commander of the 433rd Operations Group, Joint Base San Antonio-Lackland, Texas.
