Chief Master Sgt. Edward A. Ramirez is the Command Chief Master Sergeant of the 512th Airlift Wing, an associate Air Force Reserve Command unit located at Dover Air Force Base, Delaware. He is the senior noncommissioned officer responsible for the 1,650-person organization, which supports Air Mobility Command's worldwide airlift mission, operating C-5M Super Galaxy and C-17 Globemaster III aircraft. As the command chief master sergeant, he is responsible for advising the commander on mission effectiveness, professional development, military readiness, training, utilization and the health, morale and welfare of wing personnel.

Chief Ramirez enlisted in the Air Force Reserve in 1988, beginning his career as a C-5 loadmaster. Chief Ramirez has served and supported numerous contingencies, including operations Just Cause, Desert Shield, Desert Storm, Restore Hope, Enduring Freedom, Iraqi Freedom and humanitarian missions, including Joint Task Forces Rita and Katrina and most recently Hurricanes Harvey and Irma.
